Currency exchange (USD to TZS)

A member of the Visitors team will assist visitors in exchanging the equivalent of US\$50 to Tanzanian shillings if needed. Please do not bring small currency notes. US\$50 and US\$100 notes not older than 2010 are preferred.

An agent from a local phone company will be on hand to assist you with a local SIM card at a cost (not more than US\$2, to be paid in TZS) and can also add data and phone credits to your SIM.

Make your way into Arusha town and see some iconic landmarks as you head to Arusha Coffee Lodge (ACL) for a coffee farm tour and delicious lunch.

A member of the Visitor team will take you around the primary school, which is located inside the Sisia Campus, and share the school's history. This is a great chance to see the school in action.

Art and music classes with students (80 minutes)

[For the first 40 minutes, half of the group will go to an art class and the other half to a music class. They will then swap classes from 11:30am for the remaining 40 minutes.]

Art class

Art is one of the extracurricular activities that makes St Jude's unique from other schools in Arusha. Witness the work of our talented and creative students by participating in a primary school art class.

Music class

Tanzania has around 120 tribes, each characterised by a unique culture. Our music lessons mostly focus on African drumming and dances. See our enthusiastic students performing diverse African cultural songs.

Physical Education (PE) class with the students

Soak up some fun and laughs in a friendly competition with primary students. Challenge yourself by matching items in a game of Spot It, racing to play the last card in UNO, or testing your knowledge with a quiz about how well you know St Jude's. We welcome you to have lunch with some St Jude's Girls' Secondary School staff and students. Enjoy a conversation with the girls and staff you share the table with as you sample traditional Tanzanian food, such as ugali (maize stiff porridge) and beans or rice with vegetables.

6:00pm Depart for dinner at Khan's

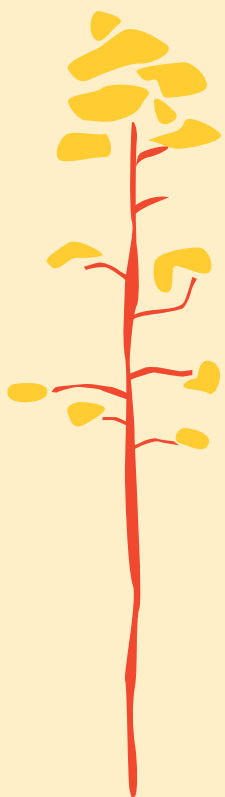
6:30pm Dinner at Khan's (chicken on a bonnet)

9:20am	Tour of Smith Campus Smith Campus is located at Usa River and is home to St Jude's Secondary School. It houses our all-boys Ordinary Level secondary school (Forms 1 to 4; first four years of secondary education) and our co-educational Advanced Level (Forms 5 and 6; the final two years of secondary). You will get to meet some of our older students, who will tell you about their dreams and aspirations for the future. You'll be amazed by the artistic talents of these students when you visit their art room and music class.
10:15am	The Big Picture activity It's a stroke of genius, and you will create a painting! Divided into teams, you will all share the goal of creating an artistic masterpiece. Each group will be responsible for painting a small segment of The Picture. Having no idea what the final image will be, you'll work together with students to ensure that lines meet and colours match. Upon completion, the canvases will be collected, pieced together, and framed, ready for the big reveal!
12:15pm	Farm project visit The farm project supports our goal of sustainability by reducing food costs and providing our students with a regular supply of fresh vegetables. The school aims to grow a wide variety of fruits and vegetables. The farm covers 12 acres of Smith Campus and has been fully funded by incredibly generous donors. We have two greenhouses, a teaching area, and a water pump that enables us to use drip irrigation to water crops. Students work on the farm on Saturdays and have classes to teach them about modern agricultural methods.

Buy coffee and a little snack before you head to the local markets.

Visit local markets.

A few kilometres from the Arusha Clock Tower is the Maasai Market, where you can see (or shop!) various Maasai trinkets and crafts. You will also visit Soko Kuu Arusha or the Arusha Central Market. This is a truly African experience where you can interact with some locals and view various stalls selling locally grown fruits and vegetables, spices, nuts, coffee, fish, meat, colourful local fabrics, and just about anything else you can think of!

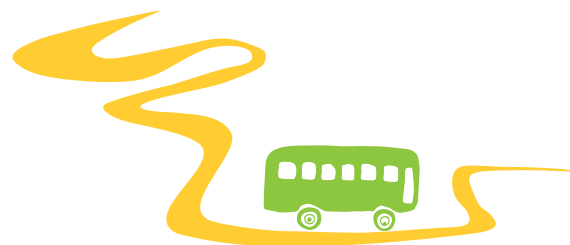

Price Structure - 2026 Graduation

Our Form 6 graduation itinerary is priced at US\$593 per person. However, our current sponsors and donors can stay for free at St Jude's for seven nights, which means the price is US\$393 per person for those supporters.

The package includes:

- Accommodation and meals as mentioned in the itinerary
- Excursions outside the school (Coffee farm tour, Maasai market, and Boma visit)
- Transportation around Arusha

Some optional extras are also available:

- Transport to and from the airport – US\$50 each way per trip
