Art class

Participate in a primary school art class. Art is one of the extracurricular activities that makes St Jude's unique to other schools in Arusha. Witness the work of our talented and creative students.

Music class

Tanzania has around 120 tribes, each characterised by a unique culture. Our music lessons mostly focus on African drumming and dances. See our enthusiastic students performing diverse African cultural songs.

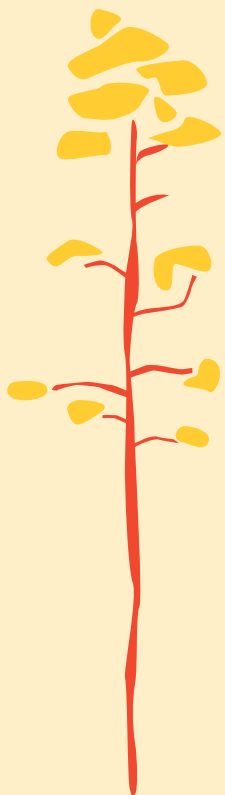
Dinner at Khan's (Chicken on a bonnet)

It's a popular and unique eating place in Arusha that is like nothing you will find at home.

9:20am	Tour of Smith Campus Smith Campus is located in Usa River and is home to our St Jude's Secondary School, which is attended by our O Level boys (the first four years of secondary) and both girls and boys in A Level (the final two years of secondary). You'll get a chance to meet some of the older students who will tell you about their dreams and ambitions for the near future. You'll be amazed by the artistic talent of these students when you visit the art room and a music class.	3:00pm	Friendly matches begin [Assembly Point: Smith sports field] All first games sessions will be 30 minutes long for basketball and volley ball, with a 5-minute rest period in between and 15 minutes interval for all others.
10:20am	Farm project visit The farm project supports our goal of sustainability by reducing food costs and providing a regular supply of fresh vegetables to our students. The school aims to grow a wide variety of fruits and vegetables. The farm covers 12 acres of Smith Campus and has been fully funded by incredibly generous donors. We have two greenhouses, a teaching area and a water pump that enables us to use drip irrigation to water the crops. 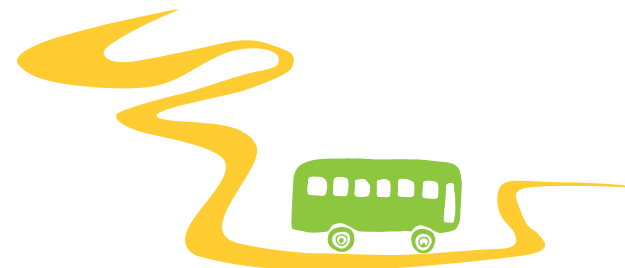

Price Structure - 2026 Parent and Cub Shared Journey

Our Parent and Cub Shared Journey is priced at US\$446 per person. However, our current sponsors and donors can stay for free at St Jude's for seven nights, which means the price is US\$296 per person for those supporters.

The package includes:

- Accommodation and meals as mentioned in the itinerary
- Excursions outside the school (Maasai market, Dinner at Khans and Boma visit)
- Transportation around Arusha
