9:20am	Tour of Smith Campus Smith Campus is located in Usa River and is home to our St Jude's Secondary School, which is attended by our O Level boys (the first four years of secondary) and both girls and boys in A Level (the final two years of secondary). You'll get a chance to meet some of the older students who will tell you about their dreams and ambitions for the near future. You'll be amazed by the artistic talent of these students when you visit the art room and a music class.
10:20am	Farm project visit The farm project supports our goal of sustainability by reducing food costs and providing a regular supply of fresh vegetables to our students. The school aims to grow a wide variety of fruits and vegetables. The farm covers 12 acres of Smith Campus and has been fully funded by incredibly generous donors. We have two greenhouses, a teaching area and a water pump that enables us to use drip irrigation to water the crops. Students work on the farm on Saturdays and have classes to teach them about modern agricultural methods.
