4:45pm

Arrive at Kilimanjaro International Airport

(Flight TBC)

A St Jude's bus will pick you up from the airport and transfer you to St Jude's.

6:00pm

Arrive at St Jude's Sisia Campus

[Assembly point: Visitors Centre]

Sign Visitor Registration Forms and go through St Jude's Personal Communication Policy and Child Protection Code of Conduct.

6:05pm

Introduction about the school and watching videos.

(Assembly point: Visitors Centre)

Watch six short orientation videos and learn about St Jude's in general. You'll get a brief insight into what we do at St Jude's and then be shown to your rooms.

6:35pm

Relax, unpack and maybe have a drink

Drinks at The Waterhole

The Waterhole is a local bar just outside the school gate. It opened in 2004 and you will almost always find locals and volunteers gathering after work hours for a few drinks. Karibu (you're welcome in Kiswahili) anytime. Don't be afraid to grab a stool and join the ever-growing circle.

Enjoy tea break with primary students.

10:50am Class visits

[Assembly point: primary school Art and Music classrooms]

Art class

Participate in a primary school art class. Art is one of the extracurricular activities that makes St Jude's unique from other schools in Arusha. Witness the work of our talented and creative students.

Music class

Tanzania has around 120 tribes, each characterised by a unique culture. Our music lessons focus on African drumming and dances. See our enthusiastic students performing diverse African cultural songs.

12:50pm Lunch with primary students

(Assembly point: primary dining hall)

We welcome you to have lunch with some staff and students. This is an excellent way to sampleg traditional Tanzanian food, such as ugali (maize porridge) and beans, or rice with vegetables.





01:20pm Reading with primary students

[Assembly point: primary school library]

Enjoy a reading class with some primary students who are still learning English! You are more than welcome to read a book with them.

02:00pm

Meeting with Sponsor Relations team

(Assembly point: Visitors Centre)

Each year we welcome a brand-new group of students into the St Jude's family! This is your opportunity to learn more about our sponsorship programs.

03:30pm

Home visit or bus ride

The Experience and Community Programs Senior Manager will communicate with you about when your home visit will be scheduled. Depending on your schedule, you will do one of the below activities during this time:

Home visit

A St Jude's student will take you to their home and introduce you to their family, where you will experience the famous Tanzanian hospitality. Your curiosity about their life will be equally matched by their curiosity about yours, so be prepared to ask and answer lots of questions! This opportunity is available to non-sponsors and is definitely a unique insight into the lives of our students and their families.

Dinner at Khan's Barbeque (BBQ)

Khan's BBQ is a local mechanics shop by day and restaurant by night. They pull out the grills, roast some chicken and serve a great variety of salads. It's a popular and unique eating place in Arusha.

9:20am Tour of Smith Campus

Smith Campus is located in Usa River and is home to our St Jude's Secondary School, which is attended by our O Level boys (the first four years of secondary) and both girls and boys in A Level (the final two years of secondary).

You will have the chance to meet some of the older students who will tell you about their dreams and ambitions for the near future. You'll be amazed by the artistic talent of these students when you visit the Art room and a Music class.

10:20am Farm project visit

The farm project supports our goal of sustainability by reducing food costs and providing a regular supply of fresh vegetables to our students. The school aims to grow a wide variety of fruits and vegetables. The farm covers 12 acres of Smith Campus and has been fully funded by incredibly generous donors. We have two greenhouses, a teaching area and a water pump that enables us to use drip irrigation to water the crops.

Students work on the farm on Saturdays and have classes to teach them about modern agricultural methods.

11:00am Short break

15 minutes rest at our Smith Campus visitors accommodation area.

11:15am Swahili and cultural lesson

During the session you'll get a chance to interact with the students and have a lot of fun whilst learning at the same time. The students will enjoy taking on the role of the teacher, no doubt being entertained as you try and twist your tongue around basic Kiswahili being taught some basic Tanzanian cultural facts.







12:15pm	Help serve lunch for our secondary students
12:35pm	Lunch with our secondary students [Assembly point: Smith dining hall]
1:20pm	Depart from Smith Campus
2:00pm	Arrive at Sisia Campus for a short rest
2:30pm	Cooking lesson Learn to cook traditional Tanzanian food with the guidance of our graduate volunteers. You'll get to eat the food you have made.
3:00pm	Rest and own arrangements
3:30pm	Moivaro Village walk Guided by our graduate volunteers, you will take a short stroll around the Moshono Village to see the local sights and the world surrounding St Jude's. Arriving at Moivaro Boarding Campus, you will be warmly welcomed into our boarding rooms and shown around the school farm and other attractions around the boarding campus.
4:30pm	Arrive at Sisia Campus and have a short rest
4:50pm	Bus ride with students Hop on one of our yellow school buses to enjoy a ride with the students as they get dropped home. It's a round-trip ride from the school that gives you the opportunity to see where some of our students live, plus sing songs and learn what they've been up to at school that day.

Primary Assembly


Friday at 3.30pm

Cultural activities

Kisongo Market and Boma visit

Kisongo is a small town located about an hour from the school. This is an authentic experience and an opportunity to interact with the locals, purchase colorful Maasai fabrics and, if you are up for it, eat fresh barbequed goat! After the markets, visit a traditional Maasai Boma or village. Meet members of an ancient tribe who are still living within their culture, even in today's modern world.

Maasai Choir

Meet a local Maasai choir and enjoy their singing and gain insight into the traditions and culture of the Maasai people.

Maasai Craft Market

Hidden in the heart of Arusha is the wonderful Maasai Craft Market where you can purchase all of your souvenirs to take home. You will be welcomed by absolutely every store owner so this alone can turn into a half-day experience if you have the patience and enjoy bartering.

Cultural Heritage Centre

The Cultural Heritage Centre in Arusha presents crafts and artifacts by hundreds of tribes from both Tanzania and intercontinental Africa. The centre sells everything from masks, traditional weapons and tanzanite to wood carvings of all shapes and sizes.



Additional activities



Day trips

Serval Wildlife

You can take a trip to Serval Wildlife, a luxurious ecotourism safari park and resort with the student whose academic scholarship you support.

Explore Arusha

You will get the chance to explore Arusha town, buy a SIM card for your phone, a coffee or snack and visit the Maasai craft and local markets. Town landmarks include the Clock Tower or Shoppers, the shopping mall in town. The Kilombero market is right across the street. This is a good chance to get any personal items you may need and to experience local transport in Tanzania.

Coffee Farm

From US\$45 per person depending on group numbers (lunch and transport included)

The trip starts from St Jude's around 9am with a 25 min drive to Nkoaranga. You will meet your local guide and walk through the village to the Aranga Organic Coffee Nursery. One of the farmers will explain how coffee is grown. After the visit you will walk down to the garden of Wild Tracks and enjoy a hot Tanzanian lunch. Finally, the tour ends at the roasting factory where you can see how coffee is roasted, ground and packed.

Maji Moto

Note: Own expenses US\$5 per person for entry to Maji Moto (hot springs) Additional \$100 return transport costs

A natural hot spring set in an oasis in a typically dry area near Mount Kilimanjaro. Maji Moto is set among shady trees where you can relax with a picnic and enjoy swimming in the fresh, crystal clear blue waters.



Go on Safari

The School of St Jude is just minutes from the centre of Tanzania's safari capital, Arusha. This town is the gateway to popular East African National Parks and game reserves such as Ngorongoro Crater, the vast plains of the Serengeti, Lake Manyara, Tarangire and Arusha National Park.
