8:30am

Arrive at The School of St Jude

[Assembly point: Visitors Centre]

Sign the Visitor Registration Forms and go through the St Jude's Personal Communication Policy and Child Protection Code of Conduct.

8:40am

Introduction

[Assembly point: Visitors Centre]

Watch six short orientation videos and learn about St Jude's in general. You'll get a brief insight into what we do at St Jude's.

9:10am

Tour of Moshono Sisia Campus [Girls' secondary school and primary school]

[Assembly point: Visitors Centre]

A member of the Visitor team will take you around the primary school and girls' secondary school, that are located inside Sisia Campus. You'll hear about the school's history and have the chance to see the school in action.

Art class

Participate in a primary school art class. Art is one of the extracurricular activities that makes St Jude's unique from other schools in Arusha. Witness the work of our talented and creative students.

Tanzania has around 120 tribes, each characterised by a unique culture. Our music lessons focus on African drumming and dances. See our enthusiastic students perform diverse African cultural songs.

Enjoy a reading class with some primary students who are still learning English! You are more than welcome to read a book with them.

To date, St Jude's has supported 524 BSJ scholars to graduate from university.

Other activities you could do

Extracurricular activities

Monday afternoon only

Every week students and teachers participate in extracurricular activities that enrich our students' academic curriculum. New skills such as craft and juggling expand their minds and encourage creativity and teamwork outside the formal classroom environment.

Swahili and cultural lesson

During the session you'll get a chance to interact with the students and have a lot of fun whilst learning at the same time. The students will enjoy taking on the role of the teacher, no doubt being entertained as you try and twist your tongue around basic Swahili before singing back and being taught some basic Tanzanian cultural facts.

Q&A with Gemma

This is your opportunity to spend time with our Founder, Gemma Sisia, to learn more about her motivation and future plans for The School of St Jude.

Cooking lesson

Learn to cook traditional Tanzanian food with the guidance of some of our CSY volunteers and after that get a chance to eat the food that you have made.

Moivaro village walk

Guided by a Community Service Year Intern, you will take a short stroll around the Moshono village to see the local sights and the world surrounding St Jude's. Arriving at Moivaro Boarding Campus, you will be warmly welcomed into our boarding rooms and shown around the school farm and other attractions around the boarding campus.

Assembly

Experience a weekly assembly where you will share in the excitement of students receiving awards for outstanding behavior and achievements. At primary school, the assembly is on Fridays at 3:50pm, Smith Secondary campus on Thursdays at 4:00pm, and St Jude's Girls Secondary on Tuesday's at 4:00pm).
